Wicomico Public Library

County-Based Library System

- Wicomico Public Library is a county library system within Maryland's public library network.
- It operates as an independent nonprofit entity with its own Board of Trustees, while serving as the designated public library system for Wicomico County.





Demographics and Economic Landscape

- Wicomico County's population: ~104,000 (as of 2023), with Salisbury home to approximately 33,000 people.
- Salisbury is one of the youngest cities in Maryland, with a median age of 30.
- Racial/Ethnic Breakdown: ~57% White, 29% Black or African American, 8% Hispanic or Latino, 4% Asian, and a growing immigrant and refugee population.
- The region has higher-than-average poverty rates (~20%) and faces ongoing challenges around housing instability, food insecurity, and limited transportation access



The Community Support Center

Why It Was Needed

- Wicomico Public Library recognized a growing number of patrons facing acute challenges: homelessness, mental health crises, substance use, and lack of access to social services.
- Security incidents were increasing—but so was the understanding that enforcement-based approaches didn't align with the library's mission of equity, dignity, and service.

How it was formed

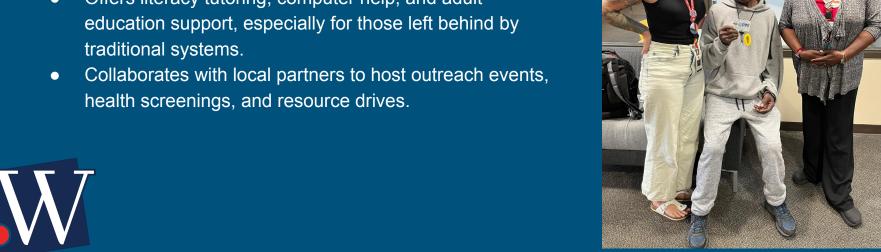
- In 2022, library leadership made a bold shift: funds originally designated to hire uniformed security guards at the downtown Sarbanes Branch were reallocated to establish the Community Support Center.
- Instead of enforcement, the library chose engagement: hiring a full-time Community Support Worker with a background in social work.



The Formation of the Community Support Center

What the Center Does

- Provides direct assistance with housing referrals, job searching, social service navigation, and crisis response.
- Offers literacy tutoring, computer help, and adult traditional systems.

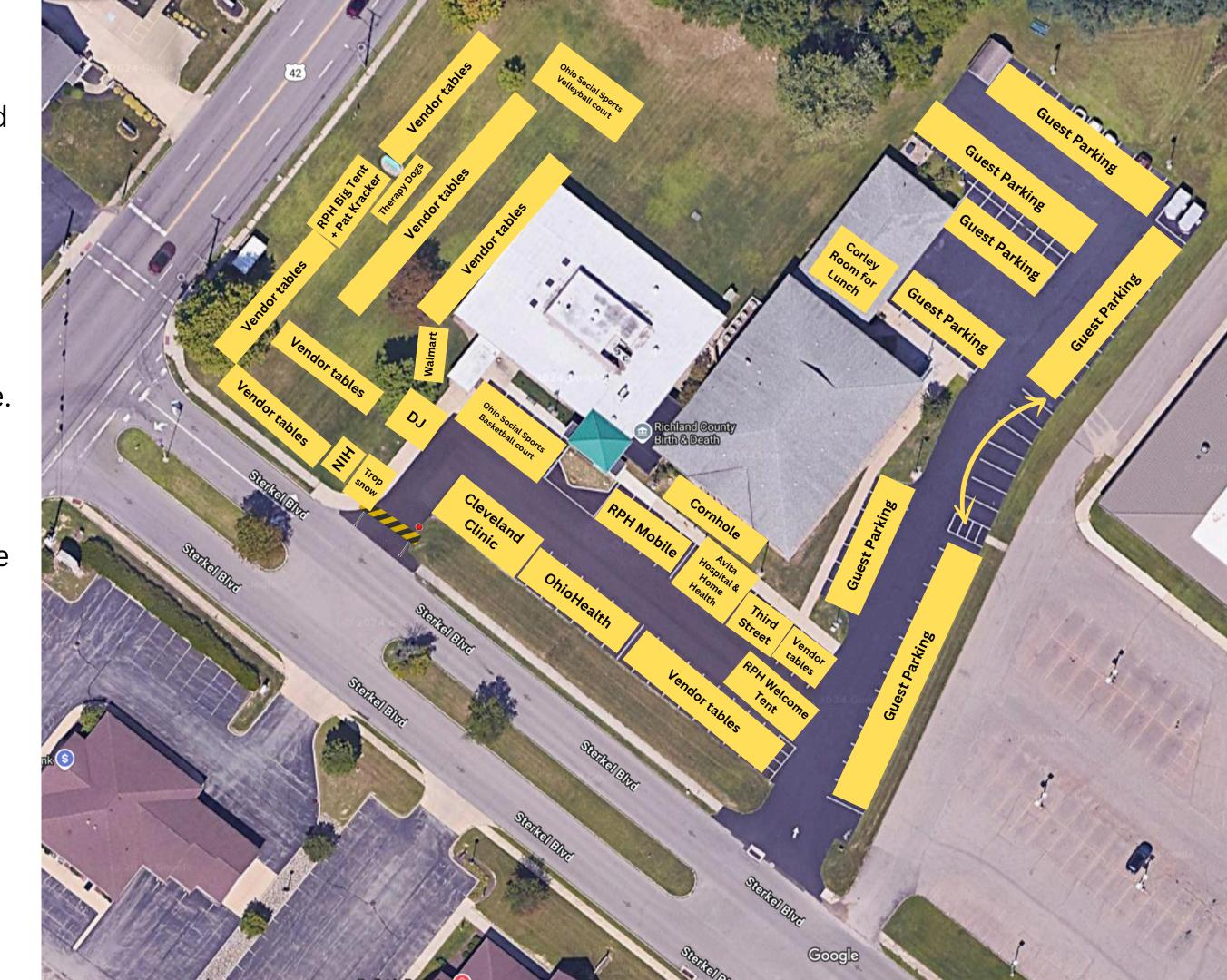






Event Map

The Bridge Public Health Misses

The answer to making an impact isn't in more data, more complex communication plans, or more advanced technology. It's in returning to humanity's oldest tool for building understanding and trust: story.

How Storytelling Creates Change

Through intentional storytelling initiatives, organizations don't just collect anecdotes—they create systematic pathways for:

- Building community trust
- Developing strategies based on deep listening and wisdom (aka strategies with buy in and impact)
- Creating powerful advocacy tools
- Reconnecting staff with purpose
- Designing programs that work:



The good news? Each organization already has the tools to bring stories forward. A few shifts are needed:

- We have to let go of talking points. I promise it is okay. The looser we hold the story/conversation, the more magic becomes possible.
- Look at you current operations, where can you add storytelling/gathering/listening/sharing in?
- Look at your outputs, where can story be woven into your grant reports, website, advocacy tools, newsletter, strategy?



I was raised on stories.

As an Indigenous person, I grew up in a world where a simple "yes" or "no" was rarely the end of an answer. Questions were invitations. They are openings for long, winding stories that carry knowledge, caution, history, and humor. Storytelling is how we remember. How we make decisions. How we make meaning.

So when I began working in public health—first as a student, then as a researcher, strategist, and care worker—I couldn't understand why systems built to serve communities had never listened to them. I founded The Center for Story & Strategy to change that.

The Center for Story & Strategy exists because our health is not individual—it is interdependent. Our well-being is shaped by overlapping systems: housing, education, food, justice, history. And yet, most of these systems continue to ignore the voices of the people they affect most, worshiping quantitative data while dismissing the expertise held in lived experience.

At The Center for Story & Strategy, we treat story as strategy. We believe that stories are not embellishments to programs or reports—they are infrastructure for trust, insight, advocacy, and change. We partner with organizations across public health, philanthropy, education, and justice to integrate storytelling into everything from program design to policy influence. Not as a feel-good extra—but as a core method for transformation.

The Center for Story & Strategy is for organizations ready to listen differently, design more justly, and build in ways that communities can trust. The solutions to our biggest challenges are already here in the stories of your community. Our work is to hear them, honor them, and act accordingly.

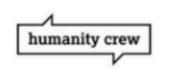
